Screen #1- Start by copying/pasting the Provider's notes or EMR into the field provided on the left and click "Scan Notes." Code Recommendations will then be listed in the field to the right by code set (ICD-9-CM, ICD-9-v3, CPT, HCPCS, and ICD-10-CM [beta]). The icon of the magnifying glass over the open book (circled in orange) will bring up a window called CodeBookView™ which makes scanning the surrounding codes at a glance quick and easy (see Screen #2 on next page).

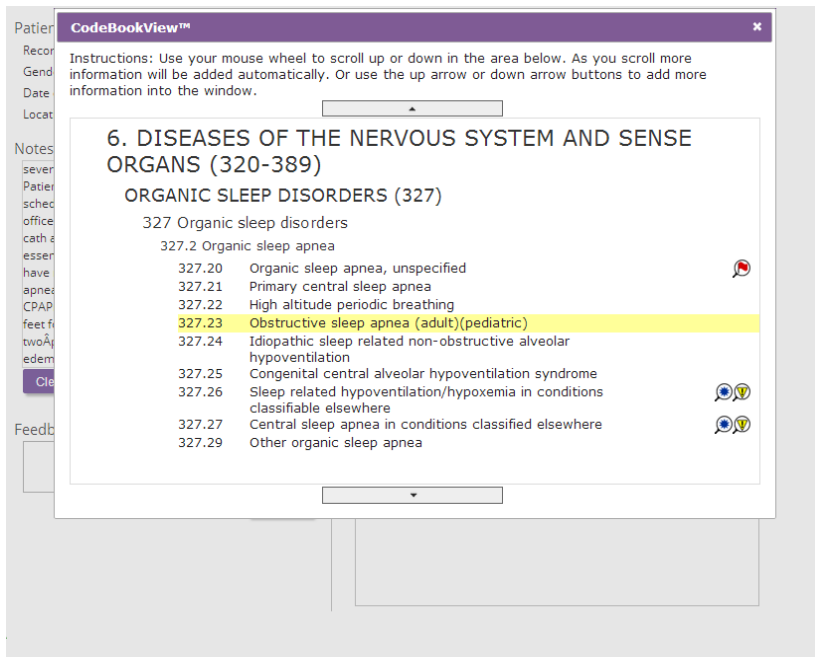

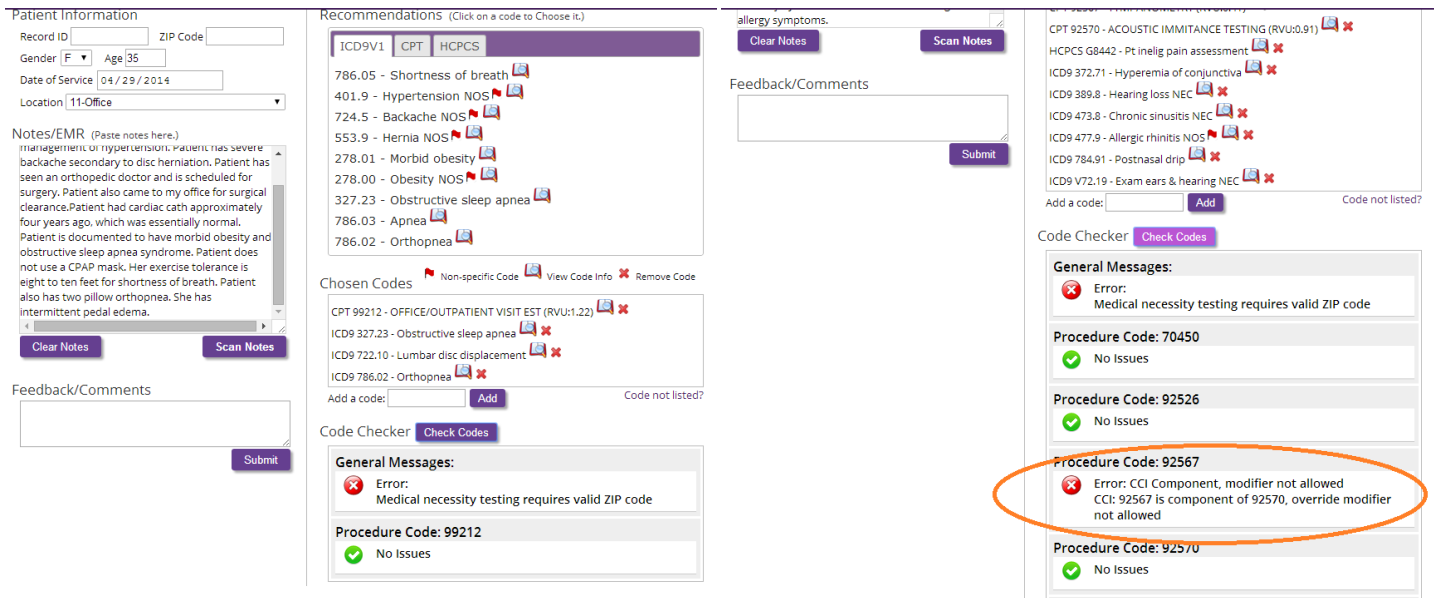
